



A QUIET PLACE

Steps to a meaningful devotion time By John Gillespie, Associate Pastor



remember the first time I was told to have a "quiet time". I was 17 years old and had recently dedicated my life to Christ in a small country church in East Texas. My youth pastor had given a charge to all the students to have a "quiet time" with God each morning before school. He began to share with the group

that a daily time with God was essential to grow as a Christian. Still excited from my recent conversion I desperately wanted to grow as a new believer but there was one problem. No one showed me how to actually have a meaningful devotion time. I remember opening a bible and placing my index finger on random verses as I read them aloud. As you can imagine this was extremely boring and by day three I completely gave up on having a quiet time. It was years later before I learned how to have a real meaningful time with God. A few weeks ago I came across this acrostic, and I think it gives a good picture how we should approach our time with God. I think most people can accomplish these six steps within 10-20 minutes each day.

Devotion time should always begin with Prayer:

prayer. Prayer for yourself, family, church,

Reading: God's word never returns void. Always give

time to read God's word.

Reading God's word is not enough. We Apply:

must apply and live out God's word in our

daily lives.

Imagine: Allow time to mediate on God's word. Allow the Holy Sprit time to guide your

thoughts.

Surrender: As the Holy Spirit guides your mind surrender

to His calling.

Experience: Remember God has called you into a relationship with Him. Experience and enjoy that

We are now in the stage of packing the food to fill the container. This process simply needs man power to complete. There are 2 days to join in this mission-Friday, February 20th from 4:00 p.m.-10:00 p.m. (2 hr. shifts) or Saturday, February 21st from 8:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. (2 hr. shifts). We ask that you volunteer for a minimum of 2 hours but if you would like to do more than 2 hours you can.
